civil society. NGOs have often been instrumental in documenting human rights abuses during civil conflict or counterinsurgency actions, which justify transitional justice efforts once the conflict is. For any human rights clause to work in this context it will have to be widely adopted and implemented; otherwise it will simply be seen as uncompetitive.
